Appropriate documentation verifying the scheduling dates, locations, hours of attendance, certificate of participation, and appropriate certificate of continuing medical, dental or nursing education will be provided at the completion of the conference. THE ISLANDS OF FRENCH POLYNESIA

Paul Gauguin's delightful land of French Polynesia is a scant seven and a half hours flying time from Los Angeles (closer than the Caribbean or Europe). It is an enchanted archipelago so removed from urban pollution and the cares of the world that it might as well be the other side of the universe.

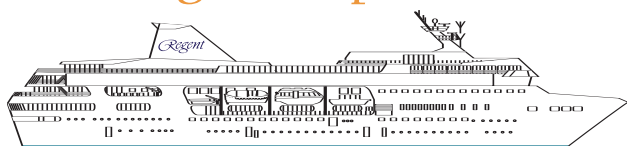
ABOUT YOUR HOSTS
