Continuing Education Recognition Awards

Physicians: This program has been reviewed and is acceptable for up to 18 prescribed hours for the main Tanzania safari and 6 prescribed hours for the Rwanda pre-safari by the American Academy of Family Physicians.

Dentists: The Professional Education Society, as provider, is authorized to confer up to 18 hours of California Continuing Education credit units and 18 FAGD/MAGD credit hours with the Academy of General Dentistry for the main Tanzania safari and 6 credit hours for the Rwanda pre-safari. The Professional Education Society is an ADA CERP Recognized Provider.

Nurses: The provider is approved by the California Board of Registered Nursing, Provider Number CEP 5428 and is authorized to confer 18 contact hours for the main Tanzania safari and 6 contact hours for the Rwanda pre-safari. Although the California Board of Registered Nursing does not approve individual continuing education courses, providers are required by law to be approved by the Board. Reciprocity for continuing education hours for nurses is available in most states.

Tax Deduction

The travel symposium for Tanzania, has been designed to comply with current IRS convention rules and deductibility requirements under Code Section 274(h)(1) as directly related to the conduct of the attendee's profession and meeting the reasonableness standard of the foreign seminar rules. The formal meetings will be scheduled with lectures and discussions. Seminars in conference rooms, clinics or hospitals will be conducted by foreign speakers as well as distinguished members of the Professional Education Society. Appropriate documentation verifying the scheduling dates, locations, hours of attendance, certificate of participation, and appropriate certificate of continuing medical, dental or nursing education will be provided at the completion of the conference. Sunday, August 22: Depart U.S. / Amsterdam

Overnight flight to Amsterdam on KLM to Kilimanjaro (JRO) Airport in Arusha.

Monday, August 23: Arrive Tanzania Overnight at Serena Mountain Village.

Tuesday, August 24: Arusha to Tarangire National Park

Park is renowned for the country's largest herds of elephants and 1,000 year old baobab trees. Overnight at Tarangire Sopa Lodge.

Wednesday, August 25: Tarangire National Park

Game drives and sun set with sundowner cocktail back at the lodge. Overnight at Tarangire Sopa Lodge.

Thursday, August 26: Tarangire National Park

Visit to Mto Wa Mbu village and school and enjoy an amazing sunset over the Ngorongoro Crater. Overnight at Ngorongoro Serena Lodge.

All transportation in Tanzania will be in 4x4 Land Cruisers with a maximum of 6 people. Every client will have a window seat. Tanzanian safaris are adventurous, but are not particularly physically demanding. However, all travelers should be capable of walking over uneven terrain and travelling in Land Cruisers on dusty, bumpy and unpaved roads for extended periods of time.

About our Tour Operator: Akorn is a Destination Management company in Africa that is part of the Abercrombie & Kent Group of Companies. It was founded in Kenya in 1962 and has been a pioneer of luxury safaris in East Africa.

Connect to your flight to Nairobi, Kenya and a late night flight to Kigali, Rwanda.

Thursday, August 19: Arrive Kigali, Rwanda

Overnight at Kigali Serena Hotel. Rest and recover from the long flight. Afternoon of Medical/Dental symposiums. (B)

Friday, August 20: Kigali to Volcanoes National Park

Visit to Gisozi Memorial Genocide Museum. Overnight at Sabyinyo Silverback Lodge or Mountain Gorilla View Lodge (B,L,D).

Saturday, August 21: Gorilla Tracking in Volcanoes National Park

Overnight at Sabyinyo Silverback Lodge or Mountain Gorilla View Lodge (B,L,D).

Your trek will vary in length depending on which gorilla group you have been assigned to and will commence at about 7,000 feet of altitude in the upper terraced slopes of the volcano.

Sunday, August 22: Gorilla Tracking in National Park

Overnight at Kigali Serena Hotel (B,L,D). Reenter the forest for a second gorilla trek, visiting a different family.

Transfer to the airport for your outbound flight to Tanzania and begin your safari.
